Meet The Teacher!

READING AT PRIESTTHORPE

The way we teach and assess reading at school has changed a great deal this year, in line with government expectations.

Children in Y1 are assessed at the end of the year using the Government Phonic Screening test. They are tested on their ability to use their phonic knowledge to read unfamiliar words. Children in Reception and KS1 have a daily phonics lesson to teach them the required skills.

Our English teaching is based on a whole class text. All children will be involved in daily reading to support their writing across the curriculum. There will also now be a daily session where the children are read to from a class novel or book.

At the end of Y2 and Y6, children are assessed on their ability to answer questions about a text they have not seen before. The children have to provide written answers to these questions and use evidence from the text to support their thinking. Each year group now has a half-termly reading test to assess their ability to provide written answers in this way.

In order to teach the children to do this, we are going to have a weekly reading lesson where the children will be taught these skills. We are still asking that your child reads daily at home and that you continue to talk to them about their reading.

We are sending home a booklet today which will help you ask the right type of questions. It contains a range of questions which encourage children to think more deeply about what they have read. Could you please either keep the questions with their reading book, or have them to hand at home.
